Mission Update From Pastor Edie

Thanks be to God for the success of our mission team trip and to you for your prayers!

Dale Smith, Richard Morrison, Sam Spicer, and myself, representing Mission of Hope: Rotifunk Hospital, traveled to the west coast of Norway from January 19th -25th. We met with the Haugesund Rotifunk Board of Directors and Bishop John K. Yambasu of Sierra Leone Annual Conference. Haugesund Rotifunk has contributed over \$500,000 and numerous medical teams to rebuilding the hospital and treating patients for ten years. As you know, Mission of Hope has been committed to supporting the Rotifunk Hospital for more than three years, starting with our own Wrightsville UMC, and now is a mission initiative of our Conference.

The goals of the meeting were to:

- Get to know each other and our histories in Sierra Leone;
- Clearly understand the Sierra Leone annual Conference's plan for the hospital;
- Learn what each partner can contribute to this plan in terms of funding, medical expertise, supplies, and equipment.
- Prioritizing the needs, and;
- Draft two Memorandums of Understanding; one between Haugesund and the Sierra Leone Annual Conference, and one between Mission of Hope and the SL Annual Conference.

All of these goals were accomplished due to excellent leadership by God through Bishop Yambasu, and the active input of all participants. We were also blessed with a beautiful, serene location with wonderful hospitality and homemade food by our friends in Norway. Ask about how I and my fellow brothers in Christ walked on Norwegian water. Okay, so it was frozen...but it still qualifies!?

The top seven priorities were identified and assigned as follows:

- For Haugesund Rotifunk Update and restore the mission team living quarters, plan, purchase and install a solar power system, and begin sending medical teams to Rotifunk.
- For Mission of Hope the priorities are assure a continuous flow of clean water from the deep bore well, to help fund personnel costs, and help fund operation costs e.g. supplies, training, fuel, etc.
- The seventh priority for both groups is to fund increased security for the hospital site.

Please pray for this very important mission to save the lives of mothers and children in Sierra Leone. Also watch for dates and details of the mission presentation our team will make about this significant trip.

Thanks to the mission team for their excellent work. Thanks again to all for your support, and all you will do to continue this much needed work in Christ's name.





Chocolate Chip Cookies Needed for KAIROS Prison Ministry Cookies are due on Sunday, March 13th



There will be a table set up with Baking Instructions in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, March 6th

Many of the men and women in our prisons have been abandoned by their families and friends. Often these cookies are the only indication to them that they have not become simply a number in the Department of Corrections. During every 3-day weekend, a dozen cookies are distributed to every resident and correctional officer of the institution as well as to those residents participating in the Kairos weekend. Not only has this eliminated the original problem, it has resulted in the candidates being encouraged by the rest of the prison population to continue to participate so they will continue to receive cookies.

These cookies tell the residents that someone who doesn't know them still cares enough to give a part of their life -the time to bake the cookies-without wanting something in return. Such selflessness is often a unique experience for them. Most inmates in our prison system are takers, not givers. This brief experience of sharing something of value freely-often with those they do not like-has a powerful effect. Someone has said these cookies are "seeds of love" being sown in the hearts of those who know so little of the love God's children are commanded to show forth to the world.

Hopefully, this helps you understand the importance of these cookies and the importance of each volunteer who bakes the cookies. Please pray for the people who will eat your cookies as you prepare them. Who knows what hearts will be touched and what life changed by the power of prayer and your act of love in baking cookies.

Chocolate Chip Cookie Specifications for Kairos Prison Ministry

- 1. Bake ONLY STURDY Chocolate Chip Cookies. (Pillsbury Cookie dough purchased at Sams works well!)
- 2. DO NOT add fruit, nuts or coatings of ANY KIND to the cookies.
- 3. Size: Two-and-a-half (2 -1/2) to three (3) inches in diameter. Make all cookies the same size. Thin, crisp cookies break easily and cannot be used.
- 4. Allow cookies to COOL completely before bagging. Warm cookies will stick together and cannot be used.
- 5. Bag cookies in zip-lock storage or freezer bags. ONE DOZEN COOKIES PER BAG. One-quart bags are the <u>only</u> size to use that has the press seal closure. Pack 4 stacks of 3 cookies per bag. BAGS WITH SLIDE ZIPPERS ARE NOT ALLOWED INTO THE PRISON.
- **6.** Pack bags in sturdy boxes such as shoeboxes or copy paper boxes so they will survive the trip to the Correctional Institution.
- 7. Cookies are needed by March 13th, 2016.
- **8.** Cookies may be delivered to the Narthex/Fellowship Hall or to Todd Lambeth (264-2451), Bill Traina (231-9111), or Ron Guard (231-3102).

Remember, these cookies are expressions of God's love to men behind the walls of these Correctional Institutions. Bake them with care, pack them with love, and send them with your prayers.
