Unity Doesn't Mean Uniformity

One of the goals that our Administrative Council came up with for 2017 was for us to work on congregational unity as a church. Somewhat ironically, the people who most wanted this stressed had different reasons for wanting to accomplish this goal. The goal was set not long after the election so some people wanted to be sure that people of different political persuasions didn't feel uncomfortable attending worship here at Wrightsville. Others wanted us to be united in our diversity and against prejudice. Still others wanted us to be united in mission, ministry, programming, and stewardship.

So, what does it mean for a church of more than 2,000 members to be united? Especially when the vast majority of us did not grow up at Wrightsville United Methodist; but instead have a tremendous array of experiences and teachings that we bring with us from various places around the state, the country, and even the world?

When we look around we see a lot of people at odds. I am a political science major who went to Divinity School. So, I often have my eyes on politics and religion. The political world seems especially fractured into factions these days, and even my beloved United Methodist Church doesn't feel very "United" right now as we argue over issues that relate to persons who are LGBT.

There's certainly nothing wrong with having right beliefs and right practices; but it is not right to condemn others who don't share our opinions. There's so much opposition nowadays. It doesn't seem to be enough to be right about something. We are just as eager to declare someone else wrong for their different beliefs, and therefore morally corrupt. Most Christians know the scripture verse John 3:16; but fewer of us have come to learn John 3:17, "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world; but in order that the world might be saved through him." As the body of Christ, are we working harder to condemn the world or to save the world?

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, wrote a sermon once entitled, "A Catholic Spirit." He wasn't speaking directly to the Catholic Church; but rather to all Christian congregations. He used the sermon to address conflicts that had arisen between Christians over the mode of baptism and the meaning of Holy Communion, and even over how people pray in worship. Wesley said, "But even though a difference in opinions or modes of worship may prevent an entire external union, yet need it prevent our union in affection? Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without doubt, we may. In this all the children of God may unite, even though they retain these smaller differences."

Throughout the month of July we're going to be looking at this topic of unity in greater detail. The sermon series is going to be entitled "One" and it comes from the statement in our communion liturgy that reads, "By your spirit make us **one** with Christ, **one** with each other, and **one** in ministry to all the world." Each week we will look at a different phrase in that sentence, and on the last Sunday of July we will celebrate Holy Communion together as a church. I hope you will join me in worship each Sunday to explore what it means to live in unity with God and with one another through the power of the Holy Spirit.



Stephen Ministry by Beth Perry

Happy summer! Our patriotic service is coming up, one of my favorites of the year! Summer is the time for relaxing on the beach, vacationing with family, enjoying all the delights this area has to offer.

Summer is also the time to decide if you want to start Stephen Ministry training in September. As I mentioned a couple of newsletters ago, we had 20 active Stephen Ministers. As of this writing, we have had two move away and two close out long term relationships and ask for time off. Another is battling health issues and can't serve right now. A sixth has asked to be inactive due to family issues.

So now, instead of 20, we are down to 14.

If you have ever considered becoming a Stephen Minister, now is the time. Getting the 50 hours training done is a commitment but it is Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:00, one Saturday session from 9 am to 2 pm. with time off for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year.

There is reading to be done but it is manageable. Training starts in September and finishes in February.

The best part is once you finish your training and are commissioned, your time commitment is 2 hours the 4th Tuesday of each month and whatever time you spend with your Care Receiver when you are assigned one. Some people meet with their Care Receivers weekly for an hour or so, others work out less frequent person to person contact and text and call each other.

Please prayerfully consider serving your church, your pastors, and your fellow congregants in this special way. We need to have our list of trainees ready for a meeting with the other church Stephen Leaders in mid-August.

Thanks be to God, Dr. Martin Thormodsen and the Norwegians Archer Hatfield Memorial Hospital, known to us as Rotifunk Hospital now has 24 hour electricity! Electricity is provided by a new 40KW solar power system.

Now we have lights all night long to perform surgery, clean and repair wounds and broken bones, and deliver babies. Before we relied on a generator and expensive fuel. We have arrived in the 19th century. The hospital has power, clean water, security, a beautiful operating room, laboratory, maternity ward, a fine doctor and over 20 staff. Most importantly, we treated over 1500 patients in the first three months of 2017.

This is really happening!

However we still need another ambulance, a kitchen, a laundry room, and support to buy medicine, supplies, and pay staff.

Please help us keep the hospital caring for the people of Rotifunk with your prayers and donations.







"Generosity in All Places"

The above theme for the 2017 NC Methodist Annual Conference was reflected throughout the 2 ½ extended week-end days of meetings in Greenville, N.C. During the first day, the Annual Conference body expressed their generosity by taking a special offering to help the recovery efforts following Hurricane Matthew that resulted in more than 2000 homeless families in eastern NC. The generous gifts by the Annual Conference members and guests totaled \$15,535.

Five Constitutional Amendments that had been approved with a two-thirds vote at the May 2016 General Conference were voted on by our Annual Conference, along with votes from all Annual Conferences around the world. The <u>Council of Bishops</u> will certify the results at its next meeting once all of the worldwide voting concludes. The five Amendments relate to gender equality, membership inclusion, method of electing General Conference delegates, and the method of electing future Bishops. Once the worldwide voting is tabulated it will be possible to share the outcomes and specifics of the Amendments.

Four Resolutions were presented and adopted by our NC Annual Conference. Approved Resolutions included a call to urge our government to support the Paris Climate Accords, a call for Congress to appropriate the full request for monies to support the Hurricane Matthew relief needs, a call to improve road conditions in Johnston County which was inspired by the death of a youth in the Conference, and a Resolution calling for the reorganization of the NC Department of Social Services which could impact the needs for children, elderly and the poor.

In addition to voting on Amendments and Resolutions, delegates also reviewed and approved updates and proposals relating to financial, organizational, statistical, and other important business aspects of our Annual Conference.

It is always wonderful to enjoy outstanding preaching and music at Annual Conferences, and this year was no exception. Bishop Hope Morgan was outstanding in preaching the Word and in conducting the Order of Business at all times. We can all be very proud of our Bishop and other individuals in key leadership positions of our Annual Conference.

The opening of the Conference began with an All Saints Celebration and Memorial Service recognizing the 26 clergy and 23 clergy spouses who passed during the last year. Delegates paused to reflect and remember the self-less dedication and devotion these men and women had given to God, their people, and their country. This opening Service concluded with Holy Communion.

The Conference ended on Sunday morning with the Service for the Ordering of Ministry, including Licensing, Commissioning and Ordination of new Pastors, Elders, and Deacons.

Thank you once again for giving us the honor and privilege to be your laity delegates to Annual Conference. Please know that we are prepared to discuss the above Constitutional Amendments and Resolutions, and other business-related subjects with Sunday School members, as well as with other group venues of Wrightsville UMC.
