THE SEAGULL

Having an Epiphany



By the time you read this, you will probably be putting away your Christmas decorations and making resolutions for the New Year. Did you put out a Nativity Scene in your home this year? I love them. Among all the decorations at Christmas the Nativity Scene is my favorite. I've seen beautiful and expensive hand-crafted sets; and I've seen sets made out of Fisher Price toys. My grandmother had this large, but cheap plastic set that she set outside every year. Long before people bought ten foot blow up dolls of Santa Claus and Frosty the Snowman to put in their yard, the whole neighborhood knew when my Nana was getting ready for Christmas because her nearly life-size nativity scene grabbed the attention of anyone who drove by. Even as a kid it made an impression on me that Nana wanted people to know the real "Reason for the Season."

But, as many of you know, the traditional nativity scene is actually a confluence of two stories. The Gospel of Luke tells the story of the angels announcing Christ's birth to the shepherds, and the shepherds' decision to quickly go see this child lying in a manger who is Christ the Lord. There are no Wise Men in the Luke story. That story is found in Matthew. The Wise Men saw the star when Christ was born, and followed it to Bethlehem. But they didn't show up the night Jesus was born. Some speculate that the journey may have taken months. Since the Wise Men stopped in Jerusalem and asked King Herod where the child was born, and Herod subsequently announced that all boys in and around Bethlehem under the age of two should be killed, some scholars argue that Jesus may have been as old as two when the Wise Men arrived with their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. What the Bible does make clear in Matthew 2:11 is that the family is no longer staying in the stable, for when the Wise Men arrive the scriptures say, "On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother."

The point is that the Wise Men come a little later after Jesus was born. The Christian calendar recognizes their arrival each year as the start of the season of Epiphany. According to Webster's Dictionary, epiphanies are moments of sudden revelation. The Christian season of Epiphany, therefore, celebrates those moments in the Gospels where Jesus is revealed to the world as the Son of God. One of the Bible stories that is often taught during the season of Epiphany is the story of Jesus' baptism, where God, the Father, tells those gathered at the Jordan River that "This is my son with whom I am well pleased." Another text that we study is the story of Jesus turning the water into wine because it is the first miracle that Jesus performs, and again one of the first moments when people realize that Jesus is special. The story of the Wise Men is included because God reveals His Son to the Gentiles in this encounter.

As you begin a New Year I wonder where you will see Jesus. Where will be the places where Jesus is revealed in your life in 2018? What will be the moments where someone recognizes Jesus through what you say or do? I encourage you to look for the epiphanies, not just in this season in the church year, but all year as you walk with Jesus.



Each arrangement is \$40. Checks should be made payable to **WUMC** and put "flowers" in the memo line.


