## A Peek Behind the Curtain

So, a strange thing happened at the North Carolina Annual Conference a few weeks ago in Greenville, NC. My clergy colleagues elected me to be a delegate to Jurisdictional Conference next summer in Lake Junaluska, NC; and my daughter, Emily, was elected by the laity of our annual conference as a delegate to both the Jurisdictional Conference AND next year's General Conference in Minneapolis. We both consider it an honor to have been elected and a privilege to serve in our respective capacities.

Since General Conference won't take place until May 2020 and Jurisdictional Conference won't be until July 2020 we will have a year to see what happens in the preparation and build-up of these two important pieces of our United Methodist polity. I won't do it every month; but from time to time I will use this space to give you updates on what is happening. It is a unique time in the United Methodist Church and a unique opportunity to have two people from the same church serving on the delegation team so I thought you might like to know what occurs at these meetings.

First, a quick review of some definitions:

An **Annual Conference** holds the business meetings and celebrates the ministries of a connected geographical area. In the U.S. it can be the size of a state, multiple states, or parts of states depending on the number of United Methodists living in that area. Our annual conference encompasses the eastern half of North Carolina from Burlington to the coast.

**General Conference** holds the business meetings and celebrates the ministries for the entire United Methodist denomination worldwide. Each annual conference sends at least two delegates to General Conference. Our annual conference is larger than most so we get sixteen delegates – eight clergy and eight lay delegates. Some have compared General Conference to the U.S. Congress because it is our highest legislative body; but, with 46% of the delegates coming from outside the United States it actually looks more like the United Nations than the U.S. Congress.

**Jurisdictional Conferences** have basically one function. The job of the delegates to Jurisdictional Conference is to elect new bishops to the conferences within their jurisdiction. Our jurisdiction is the Southeast United States. It encompasses 14 annual conferences in 9 states east of the Mississippi River and south of Washington, DC. There are five bishops in our jurisdiction retiring next year (including our own Bishop Hope Morgan Ward) so we will be electing five new bishops next summer.

The North Carolina Annual Conference delegation meetings are therefore made up of the 16 delegates to General Conference and the 16 delegates to Jurisdictional Conference, plus 10 alternates (which seems a little excessive). So, there are 42 people in all with an equal number of clergy and lay delegates representing our annual conference.

Our first delegation meeting will take place on the day this article goes to print so it will have taken place before you receive this. But the critical thing that will take place at this meeting is that we will choose our conference's nominee for bishop. Remember, there are 14 annual conferences in our jurisdiction. Every conference gets to send a nominee to jurisdictional conference with the possibility of being elected. But there will only be five openings next year. So, the 14 people nominated will be running for 5 open spots. After the bishops are elected a smaller committee will decide where they will serve. Our conference might get one of the new bishops or it might get a bishop who already has experience leading another conference. If the person we nominate from our conference gets elected we will not receive him or her as our bishop.


But, that's one of the things on my mind this week and one of the things I'm praying about – Which clergy person in our annual conference would be the best person to serve as a bishop to another conference? Who could be a spiritual leader to an entire conference? Who would make wise appointments? Who could handle the inevitable problems that come up with clergy and churches? Who can help navigate a conference through potentially tense times? Who will challenge a conference appropriately? Who will comfort us when we need it? We can't expect anybody to be perfect; but who has the gifts necessary to take on such an important role? Our delegation will be thinking about who we could nominate to potentially serve in another conference. Meanwhile, other conference delegations around the Southeast are meeting too, and they will be praying over someone who may be our next bishop. This is the first important decision for delegations to make. As I said earlier, I'm going to let you know what is happening at these meetings. I appreciate your prayers and support as I engage in this intriguing part of Methodist structure and ministry.

## Madonna Project

In Sierra Leone, Africa, 1 in 9 infants dies at birth and 1 in 18 mothers dies while giving birth. (In the U.S., this is about 1 in 500.) The average birth weight of newborns is less than 5 pounds.

Mission of Hope: Rotifunk Hospital is working hard to change these numbers through our Madonna Project. Through this project, in prenatal and outreach clinics, expectant moms are screened for risk factors such as poor nutritional status, high blood pressure, infection, or twins. These ladies are given the opportunity to stay in the hospital for 1 week prior to their due date, receiving nutritious meals and being closely monitored. They deliver their babies at the hospital and stay 3 days after delivery to ensure the safety of both mother and baby.

Most mothers in Rotifunk cannot afford hospital stays and deliver their babies at home without medical supervision. By sponsoring a mom, you can change this scenario. The total for each mom in the Madonna Project is only \$90.00 for a 10-day hospital stay. Please help us help them with a donation of any amount towards this worthy project. Thank you so much!

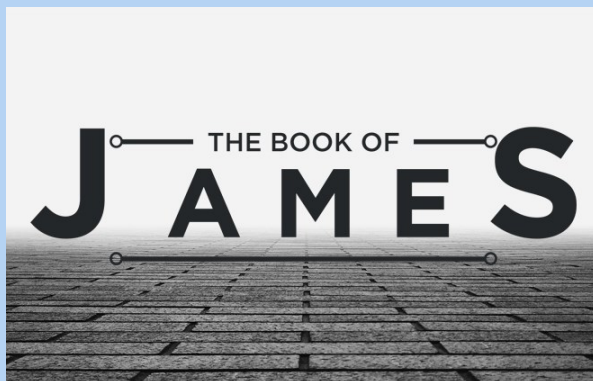

At the North Carolina Annual Conference this year, a resolution was passed which stated in part:

**Lighting and light bulbs** throughout Wrightsville UMC and public spaces in The Landing have been changed to LED lighting and bulbs

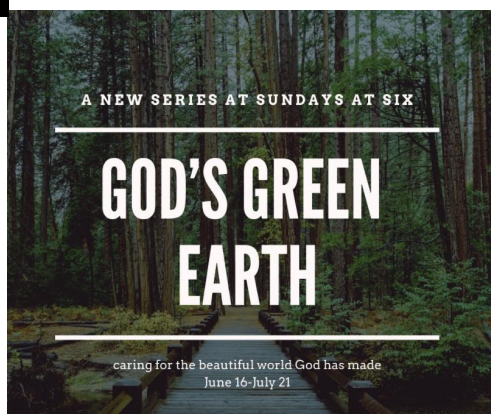
As **HVAC units** require replacement, we are replacing them with more energy-efficient units

Dear Youth Group,
