The Christian Year

All of us follow a calendar. Depending on what we need to do each of us will have different things highlighted on our calendars. Some of us are subject to calendars that are created for us. I'm thinking specifically about the school calendar. It tells us when school starts in late summer and when it ends in late spring. It tells us when we will have breaks along the way. If you have kids at home then you probably keep a close eye on the local school calendar. But, we also have calendars that might be shaped around work. Our work calendar might remind us of upcoming sales goals or annual trade shows. Depending on the job your work might be a lot busier in some seasons than in others. I am a sports fan so I follow sports calendars. In baseball, I look to see when pitchers and catchers are supposed to report for spring training, I look to see when the first regular season games are set to start, when the All-Star game is scheduled, and when the playoffs and World Series are slated to begin.

The worldwide Church follows a calendar too. It is often called the Liturgical Calendar or the Christian Year. It is designed to remind us every year of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the growth of the early church through the power of the Holy Spirit. The two most famous events on the Christian calendar are Christmas and Easter; but if you follow the calendar all year long you'll see there are many more seasons and events worth emphasizing, as well.

The Liturgical Calendar starts each year with the season of Advent in early December. The word "advent" means arrival or coming. So, during this season we get prepared for the coming of Christ. But, it isn't only a reminder that Christ has come. It is also a reminder that Christ will one day come again. Advent lasts for four Sundays each year and the color we use to symbolize Advent is purple.

This leads us to Christmas. Christmas, of course, celebrates the birth of Christ. This is the shortest season in the Christian year for it lasts from Christmas Eve/Day to Epiphany on January 6th. You know that song "The 12 Days of Christmas"? It comes from the fact that the season only lasts 12 days. The color for Christmas is white or gold.

The third season is Epiphany. An epiphany is a sudden revelation or insight. In the Christian context it is when Jesus is revealed to the world. Notice how the stories this winter will almost always talk about who Jesus is; and how they prove that He is the Son of God. The length of this season will depend on the timing of Easter, which fluctuates every year; but it is usually between six and nine weeks long. The color for Epiphany is green.

Which takes us to Lent. Lent actually comes from an old word that means "spring;" and that's because the season takes place in spring in the Northern Hemisphere. Lent focuses on Jesus' denial of worldly pursuits, his suffering, and his death. It starts with Ash Wednesday and lasts 40 days, if you don't count the Sundays. The season follows Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, which eventually leads us to Good Friday and Christ's death on the cross. The color for Lent is purple.

The real highlight of the Christian year takes place at Easter. Jesus' conquering of sin and death by rising up from the grave is the greatest miracle ever! So, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus for the next 50 days. The timing of Easter changes each year because it was determined in the year 325 AD to keep it close to the Jewish feast of Passover. Therefore, Easter takes place on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox (the first day of spring.) I, for one, would be delighted if we just set the date for Easter constant ever year, like perhaps the first Sunday of April; but those decisions are made by people far above my pay grade. The color for Easter is white.

The last season in the Christian year is Pentecost. Pentecost was an event where the first disciples of Jesus received the power of the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem after Jesus had ascended to heaven. And with that power these disciples were able to do things they had never done before in order to build up the body of Christ. The Church spread out from Jerusalem to Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth as people converted to Christianity every day. We continue to give witness to the power of the Spirit and the growth of the Church throughout the season of Pentecost, which is the longest season of the Christian year.

Finally, the Christian year comes to a close every year with Christ the King Sunday. That particular Sunday takes place in November so keep a lookout for this Sunday to come up very soon. On Christ the King we remember that Christ is not only our personal Lord and Savior, but the King of all creation. It is a fitting culmination of our year. We begin the year by waiting for a Messiah. We conclude the year by crowning him Lord of all.

I hope this has been helpful. It won't be long before we're starting a New Year together with the first Sunday of Advent coming up on December 1st. And then we'll start the journey all over again.

Lighting the Advent Wreath Candles

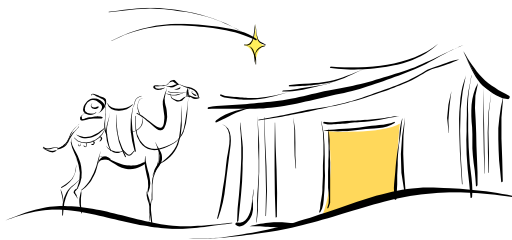

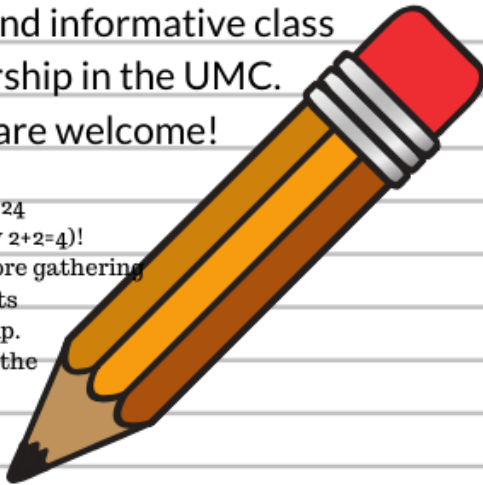


