## Will There Be Denominations of the Denomination?

I wrote to you several months ago that I would keep you informed as a church on any possible developments with the upcoming General and Jurisdictional Conferences of the United Methodist Church. Here's what's new...

The biggest news early on was that our former Associate Pastor, Edie Gleaves, has been nominated by the North Carolina Conference delegation to be a bishop. Each conference in the Southeast nominates a candidate and some caucus groups do as well. There will be five bishops retiring in the Southeast and at least 14 nominees. She will be voted on by delegates to the Southeast Jurisdictional Conference. We certainly wish Edie all the best.

The deadline for petitions to go before General Conference was in late September of 2019. Many petitions were turned in, including several that dealt with the United Methodist Church's impasse over issues of human sexuality. (Remember, that's not the only issue facing the United Methodist Church!) I have been reading different news sources and talking with colleagues to see which of these petitions might get the most traction before May's meetings. I even went to a nationwide gathering outside of Kansas City to learn more about four petitions from four very different groups that have been presented to help move the denomination forward.

Then came the news right after the first of this year that private meetings had been taking place throughout the fall of 2019 with several bishops, leaders of some of the larger interest groups that represented Traditionalists, Centrists, and Progressives, including the different groups who had shared their petitions and ideas in Kansas City. These 16 people worked out a plan under the guidance of a mediator that would make it easier for churches that wish to leave the denomination to do so while continuing to keep their property. This is not a done deal. It would still have to be voted on by the delegates to General Conference. In fact, while I may be wrong, I am under the impression that they will have to suspend the rules to even hear this proposal because it is coming in after the deadline.

But, there is a good chance it will pass. The reason is because the leaders of the largest groups at odds with one another have agreed to it and they will be encouraging the delegates who represent their viewpoints to vote for it.

What would it mean if it passes? The bottom line is that the United Methodist Church as we know it right now would splinter into two or more smaller denominations. One group, which favors a Progressive or Centrist view, would keep the name "United Methodist Church" and it would remove the restrictions on same-sex weddings and the ordination of LGBTQ people. Another group which favors the Traditional reading of scripture on this subject would start a new denomination that would keep the restrictions in place. This is not something that Traditionalists would have to start from scratch. There is a group that has been working on creating a new expression of Traditional Methodism for years, and the proposal to split would give seed money to this new denomination. But again, it is only a petition right now. It might pass, it might fail, it is certainly likely to change before May 5; and there are still questions that need to be answered.

One of the questions that I've been hearing a lot over the last few weeks is this one: "Why do the Traditionalists have to leave?" That's a very good question. The basic answer is that the leaders of the Traditionalist groups in America have been wanting to leave for quite some time. They would argue that the United Methodist Church left them a long time ago, and that as the church has become more progressive over the years the name "United Methodist" has been tarnished. This new expression of Traditional United Methodists will be eager to take on a new name. So, if that's the case, why hasn't the denomination split before now? Because the annual conference actually owns the property of each local church. Up until now it has been nearly impossible for churches to leave with their property. But as I stated earlier, this new plan that has been devised will make it easier for churches to leave with their property.

It is all very interesting. But I want to remind you that God's primary plan for doing mission in this world is through the local church. God needs the local church. This community needs the local church. You and I need the local church. The poor need the local church. The rich need the local church. The non-Christians need the local church. Your neighbors need the local church. Your family needs the local church. We need each other. Even those we disagree with. Perhaps, especially those we disagree with. The denomination is important. The work of the denomination is important. But I believe that what is happening at the local church level is far more important. I hope you will join with me and your siblings in Christ in continuing to make this church the best it can be, by the grace of God.

# Chocolate Chip Cookies Needed for KAIROS Prison Ministry Cookies are due on Sunday, March 15!

There will be a table set up with baking instructions in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, March 8.

Many of the men and women in our prisons have been abandoned by their families and friends. Often these cookies are the only indication to them that they have not become simply a number in the Department of Corrections. During every 3-day weekend, a dozen cookies are distributed to every resident and correctional officer of the institution as well as to those residents participating in the Kairos weekend. Not only has this eliminated the original problem, it has resulted in the candidates being encouraged by the rest of the prison population to continue to participate so they will continue to receive cookies.

These cookies tell the residents that someone who doesn't know them still cares enough to give a part of their life -the time to bake the cookies-without wanting something in return. Such selflessness is often a unique experience for them. Most inmates in our prison system are takers, not givers. This brief experience of sharing something of value freely-often with those they do not like-has a powerful effect. Someone has said these cookies are "seeds of love" being sown in the hearts of those who know so little of the love God's children are commanded to show forth to the world.

Hopefully, this helps you understand the importance of these cookies and the importance of each volunteer who bakes the cookies. Please pray for the people who will eat your cookies as you prepare them. Who knows what hearts will be touched and what life changed by the power of prayer and your act of love in baking cookies.

# Chocolate Chip Cookie Specifications for Kairos Prison Ministry

- 1. Bake ONLY STURDY Chocolate Chip Cookies. (Pillsbury Cookie dough purchased at Sam's works well!)
- 2. DO NOT add fruit, nuts or coatings of ANY KIND to the cookies.
- 3. Size: two-and-a-half (2 -1/2) to three (3) inches in diameter. Make all cookies the same size. Thin, crisp cookies break easily and cannot be used.
- 4. Allow cookies to COOL completely before bagging. Warm cookies will stick together and cannot be used.
- 5. Bag cookies in zip-lock storage or freezer bags. ONE DOZEN COOKIES PER BAG. One-quart bags are the <u>only</u> size to use that has the press seal closure. Pack 4 stacks of 3 cookies per bag. BAGS WITH SLIDE ZIPPERS ARE NOT ALLOWED INTO THE PRISON.
- **6.** Pack bags in sturdy boxes such as shoeboxes or copy paper boxes so they will survive the trip to the Correctional Institution.
- 7. Cookies are needed by Sunday, March 15.
- **8.** Cookies may be delivered to the Narthex/Fellowship Hall or to Todd Lambeth (264-2451), Chris Brown (571-214-7771), or Bill Traina (231-9111).

Remember, these cookies are expressions of God's love to men behind the walls of these Correctional Institutions.

Bake them with care, pack them with love, and send them with your prayers.
