# Movies to Watch at Home by Doug Lain

So, a lot of us are watching a lot of movies and television shows nowadays. I've always been fascinated with Hollywood's portrayal of Christian themes. I'm not talking about the movies released by Christian movie studios; but rather the mainstream, wide-release, secular movies that use religion to help tell their stories. To be fair, you can probably find a Christian theme or idea running through every movie, since all movies deal with some sort of conflict between right and wrong. Nevertheless, I thought I'd give you a list of mainstream Hollywood movies where the Christian theme was pretty explicit, and I'll even rate them for you based on how good I think the movie is and how deeply the movie explores Christian theology. Since I'm a pastor I'll grade the films using stoles instead of stars. Feel free to have a different opinion. It's all good. But next time you're trying to figure out what to watch check out one of these movies and then let me know what you think.

"Bruce Almighty" (2003) starring Jim Carrey, Jennifer Aniston, Morgan Freeman, and Steve Carrell. It is a comedy and rated PG-13.

Bruce is given all of God's power, and he has to decide what to do with it.

I'll give Bruce 4 out of 5 stoles for story and production, and 2 stoles on theology.

"Chocolat" (2000) starring Juliette Binoche, Alfred Molina, and Johnny Depp. It is a romantic drama rated PG-13.

Binoche's character opens up a chocolate shop in a small French town during the season of Lent when tradition holds that Christians should be fasting from chocolate. The movie explores the relationship between the Law and Grace

I'll give "Chocolat" 4 stoles for story and production, and 3 stoles for theology.

"The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe" (2005) starring Tilda Swinton, William Moseley, and Georgie Henley. It is an action fantasy rated PG.

C.S. Lewis, who wrote the Narnia series, was very deliberately trying to write a fantasy series that would turn children on to Christianity. Aslan, the lion, is an obvious Christ figure while the White Witch plays the role of the devil.

I'll give this first movie in the Narnia series 4 out of 5 stoles for story and production, and 4 out of 5 stoles for theology, as well.

"Hacksaw Ridge" (2016) starring Andrew Garfield and Sam Worthington. It is a war movie rated R.

This is based on the true story of a Christian pacifist who enlists in World War II as a combat medic; but refuses to carry a gun.

I'll give "Hacksaw Ridge" 3.5 out of 5 stoles for story and production, and 4 out of 5 stoles for theology.

"The Mission" (1986) starring Robert De Niro, Jeremy Irons, and Liam Neeson. It is a historical drama and rated PG.

De Niro plays a mercenary and slave trader in 18th century South America who is rescued from that life by a Jesuit priest. As part of his penance the priest invites him to go work with the native tribespeople at a Jesuit mission in the jungle.

I'll give "The Mission" 4 out of 5 stoles for story and production, and 4 out of 5 stoles for theology.

"The Passion of the Christ" (2004) starring Jim Caviezel. It is a biopic, rated R.

This movie explores the last 12 hours of Jesus' life where he is arrested, put on trial, beaten and crucified. Honestly, it is really hard to watch the brutal beating that Jesus takes in this movie. But the movie is also interspersed with beautiful scenes of Jesus teaching that I find very moving.

I'll give "The Passion" 4.5 stoles for story and production, and 5 stoles for theology. But, be warned, the scenes of the guards beating Jesus are really, really rough.

"Star Wars" series starring Mark Hamill, Carrie Fisher, Harrison Ford, and a lot of droids. It is a science-fiction, action franchise spanning over nine movies. The movies are rated PG and PG-13.

George Lucas, who wrote the Star Wars films, has often said that he borrowed from many religions to construct the Star Wars stories; but he obviously leans heavily on his Methodist upbringing. There's death and resurrection, a virgin birth, temptation, apocalyptic storytelling, and a spiritual force that binds everything together.

I'll give the franchise 4 out of 5 stoles for story and production. (Some of the movies are incredible and some are less so.) And, I'll give it 2 out of 5 stoles for theology.

I know there are others that should be included, like "Chariots of Fire" and "The Book of Eli"; but I haven't seen these films. Nevertheless, if you look hard enough you'll find lots of Christian imagery in the movies. Isn't Anna in "Frozen" a Christ-like redeemer who sacrifices herself for her sister only to be resurrected (unfrozen) in the end? Isn't the ring in "Lord of the Rings" a physical manifestation of sin that overtakes the one who possesses it? Even Indiana Jones goes looking for the Ark of the Covenant that held the original Ten Commandments and the Holy Grail that Jesus used at the Last Supper.

# From the (Virtual) Choir Loft...by Julia Walker Jewell

What an interesting month it has been. We went rather quickly from thinking we were preparing for the upcoming year, Holy Week and Easter in particular, to wondering how we were going to even offer worship while maintaining social distances and all of the other things that make up the new normal.

I read an article early on that said choir directors were very accustomed to having to change and rearrange their worship plans on a regular basis due to circumstances beyond their control. For example, no tenors show up or the sermon text changes at the last minute or the power goes out and the organ doesn't work on any given Sunday. I think there's some truth to that.

What I have learned through this new virtual reality is that choir directors, for the most part, have been not only quick to try new ways of doing things but quick to share their experiments and experiences with each other. While all of our conferences and workshops have been cancelled, we have been drawn even closer with one another through the sharing of ideas and support that we've given each other.

This communication, along with the frequent and clear messages from our Bishop have really helped guide me through this unprecedented time.

In the past month or so, I have learned how to make, trim and upload videos to and from various places, using various means (youtube, Dropbox, izip, etc.) I have explored and learned every part of iMovie (Stations of the Cross), held a virtual choir rehearsal and attended regular Zoom meetings. I also enjoyed receiving, viewing and compiling the many crosses submitted by our members into a slide show. We had almost 100 households participate!

Somehow, I thought working from home may mean working less. Not so. I think all of the staff can say the same. Everyone has been working hard to continue to "do what we do" while learning new ways of doing it. I am impressed with our congregation as well. You shifted rather quickly to virtual worshippers and continue to be the church, by whatever means necessary.

I am fortunate to be able to serve and work beside such an outstanding group of people.




